Building Trades Rally in Support of Mariner East

More than 100 skilled tradesmen and women from southeastern Pennsylvania who are working on our Mariner East and Marcus Hook Industrial Complex projects rallied at the Delaware County Council meeting in support of completing construction.

James Harper, business manager of the Laborers International Union of North America Local 413, was one of many union representatives speaking in support of our Mariner East pipeline system and the skilled work of local union members to ensure our pipelines operate safely.

"We just want to make sure that folks understand that we're here to do the job safely," Harper said. "We want a safe pipeline. It is our job to make sure everything is done in a safe and productive manner."

Those in attendance represented labor organizations including Boilermakers Local 13, International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW) Local 654, International Union of Operating Engineers (IUOE) Local 542, Laborers International Union of North America (LiUNA) and Steamfitters Local 420, as well as locals for Carpenters, Painters, Dry Wallers, Insulators and other unions.

The rebirth of our Marcus Hook Industrial Complex, fueled by moving natural gas liquids from the Marcellus Shale to the region using our new Mariner East pipeline system, is helping a Delaware County school district hold the line on property taxes.

While school districts throughout the state continue to increase property taxes, Chichester School District was once again able to approve a new operating budget for 2019-20 without increasing taxes.

In 2017, we announced that the increased economic activity at MHIC would contribute an additional \$4.8 million in property taxes to Chichester School District, Marcus Hook borough and Delaware County. More than \$3 million of the additional taxes are directed to the school district.

You Asked, We Answered

What type of coating is used to protect the pipe during horizontal directional drills and from UV exposure?

All newly installed steel pipelines are treated with a fusion bonded epoxy (FBE) anti-corrosion coating. This coating is UV-resistant. For HDDs, we add an abrasion resistant overcoat (ARO) that provides a hard, mechanically strong abrasion- and impact-resistant topcoat for further protection. This additional coating is also UV-resistant.
